LEAD (Law Enforcement Assisted Diversion): Divert low level offenders to appropriate mental health services or substance use treatment. 304-425-9541 ext. 1242

Peer Recovery Support Specialist: Provides emotional and crisis support, advocacy, recovery planning and relapse prevention, assistance with housing and employment. 304-425-9541 ext. 1518

ACCESS+: Provides classes to currently incarcerated and recently released individuals to assist in re-adjusting to daily life. 304-425-9541 ext. 1257

DUI Safety and Treatment Program: Six-week course for those charged with a DUI and are applying for reinstatement of driver's license. 304-425-9541 ext. 1236
